It's official, the City has given final approval for the Memorial Hall Garden! We have secured the 7500.00 in matching funds with the Community Partnership Minor Capital Program. The project is slated to start this summer and will be done in time for Carp Fair.

Thunderbolt has been informed of the developments and now has to attain permits and locates for underground services.

Donna Christie consulted Trevor Cole, who designed the Reading Garden at the Library, on the Blue Spruce. His conclusion was that it would get too big for the size of the garden and it would compete for moisture with the other plants. He suggested a Pagoda Dog Wood, which has a lovely white flower in the spring, and beautiful fall colour. The City is insisting that anything we plant be salt tolerant. Our speaker this month is an expert on flowering trees in our area. This would be an opportunity for all of our members to participate in the selection of a suitable substitute.

This week the handrail for the ramp was painted black. It is a huge improvement and will enhance the bench and urns which will be placed on either side of the interlocking brick.

Scotiabank is concentrating their fundraising efforts for the Heritage Sign, shown above. They will be hosting some BBQs and organizing raffles over the summer months. Scotiabank management has agreed to match the funds raised for this worthwhile community initiative.
