"So I kept finding ways to do it more interestingly to save space."

His efforts have resulted in a talk on "vertical vegetables" that he is bringing to our next meeting. "Vertical vegetables is basically, 'How can we grow a whole bunch of stuff in a relatively small space but taking everything we can think of and find a way of making it grow up instead of out and across?'" he explains.
