	Note: “Trumpet” applies to cultivars that have coronas (trumpet) as long or longer than the perianth (petal). For the “Large Cup”, the trumpet is more than one third of the length of the petal. For the “Small Cup”, the trumpet is <u>not</u> more than one third the length of the petal.

24	Rhubarb	Stalks should be pulled, not cut, and be of good length. The base of the stalk should not be trimmed. Leaves should be trimmed in a fan shape to approximately 2" in length.	3 stalks on a white plate

DESIGN DEFINITIONS

STILL LIFE – A design in which plant material and inanimate objects are grouped to tell a story in a unified display of rhythmic forms, textures and colours. Plant materials are subordinate in the design.

PARALLEL – A design in which three or more groupings are placed in a parallel manner with open spaces between the groupings. Parallel direction may be vertical, horizontal or diagonal. Design is in one container or containers combined so as to appear as one unit.
