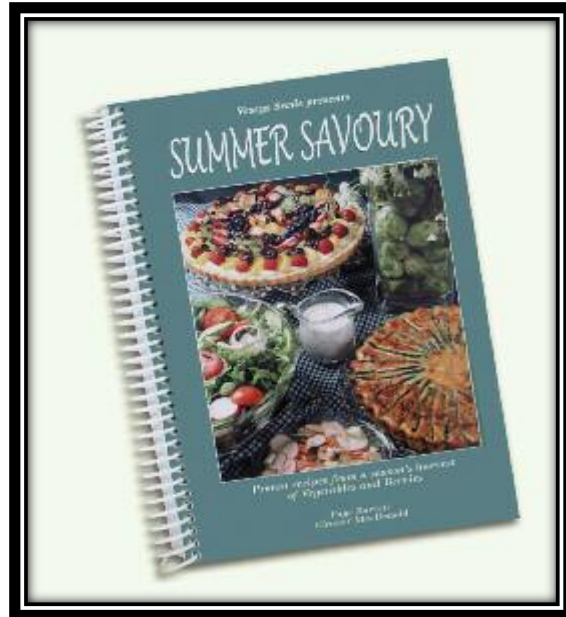
Santa Clause Parade
