## The Conservatory Garden in Central Park, NYC and Chanticleer, in Wayne Pennsylvania


with Ailsa Francis

These two gardens have very dramatic displays using colour and tender plants - both spectacular!

Ailsa trained in the Visual Arts as a young adult and pursued a graduate degree in Art History at the University of Toronto in her late twenties. During this time she was searching for her place in the world (like many of us) but knew it would be in the arts. Around the pivotal age of 30 , she fell in love with gardens after a spontaneous and inspirational trip to British Columbia. Shortly after this she sought out a
program where she could train as a horticulturist and registered in the Horticulture and Landscape Technician two year diploma program at Algonquin College. She worked for about three years as a gardener after graduating, drawing on her experience in the visual arts to create gardens and her more recent studies understanding and working with plants. It was from this base that she came to retail.

She opened her garden store in 1997 and ten years later in 2007, closed it. During this time, she hosted workshops, gave lectures, led demonstrations for newspaper 'how-to' articles and for a few years wrote a gardening column for the neighbourhood paper. She wrote a number of freelance articles for the Ottawa Citizen newspaper (on gardening, travel and various subjects) and then in 2009 was asked to become their gardening columnist. Since closing the store in 2007, she has gone back to her roots of designing and rejuvenating gardens, as well as garden consultation and planter design, and continues to write a bi-weekly gardening column for the Ottawa Citizen as well as her fledgling garden blog
