"The Lee Valley Story"

The son of company founder Leonard Lee and one of its first two employees when he was a teenager, Robin Lee loves to work with his hands, relishing his involvement in the research and development of new and innovative woodworking, gardening and other tools for which Lee Valley Tools has built a worldwide reputation over more than 30 years.

Lee, now President, will bring his thoughts on the value of manual labour and running the company, along with some cool tool prototypes, to his talk at our next meeting on November 10th.

While the company has spread to include stores across the country — the 16th one just opened in Kingston and a 17th is planned for next year in Kelowna, B.C. — and exports to more than 100 countries, its roots are still firmly planted in the Valley. Lee's parents and brother still live in Almonte, where the quaint L.G. Lee & Sons opened recently in a heritage building, throwing back to the building's early days as a small-town hardware store, old-style cash register and all.

Interviewed by our Program Director Anita Murray recently, Robin said: "I'm not going to pretend that I know anywhere near as much about horticulture as this particular group... What I can do is tell stories and answer questions."

This should be a very interesting evening. Please bring yourselves and anyone you know who is fascinated by this iconic Canadian company and its founding family.

Thanks go out to our members who helped this past week at Memorial Hall in the centre of Carp. The garden was put to bed and bulbs planted in one hour. "Many hands..."







Committees
