It is with sadness that we mark the recent passing of **Trevor Cole**, a remarkable figure in Canada's gardening community. Trevor worked at the Central Experimental Farm from the time he immigrated to Canada in 1967 through to his retirement as the last Curator of the Dominion Arboretum in 1995.

Mr. Cole was recognized internationally for his work in horticulture and garden writing. He was the author of the Canadian bestseller "The Ontario Gardener" and edited many gardening books.

Trevor was one of our club's founding members and he gave us a living legacy in the design of our ongoing community contribution, the Reading Garden at the Carp Branch of the Ottawa Public Library.


The executive will be thinking about ways to honour Mr. Cole and his contribution to our Club and community.
