Jumping Worms


Jumping Worms are now in southern Ontario between Hamilton and Toronto. They destroy the upper area of soil in gardens and forests. There is no deterrent.

While still far enough from our area, let's keep our eyes open and adopt practices which will slow down the spread such as being careful to inspect the soil around donated and purchased plants at plant sales.
